GAS RATES TO BE REDUCED

Natural gas rates are changing effective April 1. The Gas Cost Recovery Factor will **decrease** nearly 6 cents from \$0.5417 to \$0.4829 per ccf. The monthly and distribution rates have not changed.

SAFETY IN NUMBERS SAVES LIVES & PROPERTY!

9-1-1 calls have faster response time with easy readable street numbers.

In an emergency firemen, policemen, and EMS may have difficulty finding your house if your address numbers are not easy to see from the street. This delay may be the difference between life and death.

- Numbers should be of **contrasting or reflective colors** to their background and not less than 4 inches in height.
- The proper use and display of street addresses are assigned by your municipality. **Check to be sure you are using the correct street numbers.**
- In the absence of a mailbox, use a post placed adjacent to the driveway, with address numbers on both sides.



PIE&G PAYS TAXES TOO - \$1,124,498.76

Not only does Presque Isle Electric & Gas Co-op pay property taxes on our main office building, but we also pay property taxes on all poles, underground electric lines and natural gas pipeline. In 2014 we paid \$1,124,498.76 in property taxes. Currently, we pay property taxes in 31 townships for natural gas infrastructure and 61 townships for electric infrastructure. Taxes do not appear as a line item on your bill; they, like all expenses required to provide service to members, are factored into rates.

Don't forget to contact our office to let us know you are back from vacation. You will need to provide a current meter reading on your electric and/or natural gas accounts and change your address back to your **permanent local** residence.
