SCR Factor Adjustment

At a Special Open Meeting held October 1, 2013, the PIE&G board of directors approved a new Power Supply Cost Recovery (PSCR) factor of \$0.00106 per kilowatt hour which is a decrease from the current \$0.00319 per kilowatt hour. The PIE&G board approved the new factor in anticipation of decreased wholesale energy costs. The decrease will be reflected on bills rendered on or after February 1, 2014.

The purpose of the PSCR factor is to allow the utility to collect only what is needed each budget year to cover our power supply costs. PIE&G purchases its electricity from a wholesale power supplier whose generation and transmission costs may change frequently and unexpectedly throughout the year. Those costs are passed through to PIE&G members via the PSCR factor on the member's electric bill. Periodic adjustments to the PSCR factor are necessary to help PIE&G keep any over- or under- collections of PSCR-related revenue to a minimum.

The PSCR is a pass-through cost and does not contain margins for PIE&G. Most other electric utilities in Michigan have a PSCR factor on their electric bills.



The Power is Out and You're on Oxygen – What Now?

BE PREPARED WITH A BACK UP PLAN



PIE&G's goal is to keep your power on without interruptions but repairs and inclement weather affects our ability to do so. When the power goes off and you're on oxygen or have other medical needs that require electricity, what do you do?

PIE&G is located in Onaway and serves approximately 36,000

electric members throughout northeast Michigan. The service territory encompasses nine counties, ranging north to the Mackinac Bridge and south to Fairview. Due to the vast distances our crews must travel during power outages and the unpredictability of Mother Nature, no utility can guarantee continuous electric service at all times.

If you have a medical situation that requires electric powered equipment, we recommend that before the power goes out, you consult with your physician to insure that you have an emergency plan in place to be prepared at all times. Some alternatives include having battery packs available or a gas or diesel powered generator for back up service. You may need to temporarily relocate to a friend or family member's home that has electricity or contact the Red Cross or 911 in an emergency.

If you require medical equipment, be prepared with a backup plan BEFORE the power goes out!

HELP US KEEP THE LIGHTS ON!

Remember that PIE&G depends on townships, villages, and members to request repairs for street and security lights. We do not conduct inspections for burnt out bulbs or vandalism. If you see a light on public property that needs repair, contact your local governmental representative. If the security light is on your property, contact PIE&G at (800) 423 6634. When we get notice of a light that needs repair, we issue a work order and take care of the problem as soon as possible. But we depend on you for information to keep the street lights on!

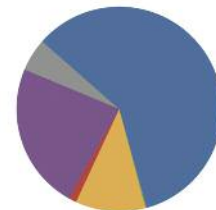

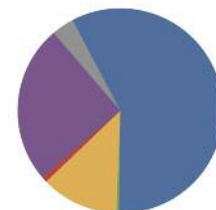
