Alpena District:



HOME HEATING ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS FOR THE 2022-2023 SEASON

The Winter Protection Plan (WPP) protects enrolled seniors and low-income members from service shut-offs and high utility bill payments during winter months. If you are eligible and you sign an agreement with us, your utility service will remain on (or restored with the WPP) from November 1 through March 31, as long as you:

- pay at least 7% of your estimated annual bill each month, and
- make equal monthly payments between the date you apply and the start of the next heating season on any past due bills.

When the protection period ends (March 31), you must begin to pay the full monthly bill, plus part of the amount you owe from the winter months when you did not pay the full bill. Participation does not relieve customers from the responsibility of paying for electricity and natural gas usage, but does prevent shut-off during winter months as long as the scheduled payments are received by the due date. You qualify for the plan if you meet at least one of the following requirements:

- age 65 or older,
- receive Department of Health and Human Services cash assistance, including SSI,
- · receive Food Assistance,
- · receive Medicaid, or
- household income is at or below the 150% of poverty level*.

Seniors citizen members (65 or older) who enroll in the WPP are not required to make specific payments between Nov. 1 and March 31. Service for seniors can be restored without any payments.

Note: All members 65+ are eligible regardless of income. Members are responsible for all electricity and natural gas used. At the end of the protection period, participants must make arrangements with PIE&G to pay off any money owed before the next heating season. Seniors are encouraged to pay what they can over the winter to avoid large, unmanageable bills and shut off when the protection period ends.
