

NATURAL GAS RATES EFFECTIVE APRIL 1

Effective April 1, 2019, natural gas rates will change. The Gas Cost Recovery Factor (GCR) will decrease (.0004 cents) as the GCR is lowered from \$0.4158 cents to \$.4154 cents per ccf. The monthly availability and distribution rates have not changed. Please refer to the table below for the itemized charges.

PIE&G PAYS TAXES TOO

Did you know Presque Isle Electric & Gas Co-op pays property taxes on its main office building and on all poles, underground electric lines and natural gas pipeline? In 2018, PIE&G paid \$1,167,527.73 in property taxes to the various cities and townships served. Currently, PIE&G pays property taxes in 46 townships for natural gas infrastructure and in 61 townships for its electric distribution infrastructure. These taxes do not appear as a line item on your bill, but like all expenses that are required to provide utility service to members, taxes are factored into rates.

9-1-1 calls have faster response time with easy readable street numbers

In an emergency, fire departments, police and EMS may have difficulty finding your house if your address numbers are not easily seen from the street. This delay may be the difference between life and death.

- Numbers should be of contrasting or reflective colors to their background and not less than 4 inches in height.
- The proper use and display of street addresses are assigned by your municipality. Check to be sure you are using the correct street numbers.
- In the absence of a mailbox, use a post placed adjacent to the driveway, with address numbers showing on both sides.
