The PIE&G Communities First Fund, established in 1998, supports the philanthropic needs of organizations within our service area, focusing on humanitarian, youth, educational, and civic development projects. Our independent Board of Directors determines fund allocations.

This fund assists local emergency responders, fire departments, youth organizations, law enforcement, charities, and schools. Members can participate by voluntarily rounding up their utility bills to the next whole dollar, averaging about 50 cents a month—tax-deductible and totaling around \$6 annually per meter.


Winter Electrical Safety: Protect Your Home



A power surge is typically caused by lightning, changes in electrical loads, faulty wiring or damaged power lines.

Install power strips with surge protection to protect sensitive equipment.

- · Easy to use (just plug them in)
- Protect electronics plugged into the device
- · Must be replaced over time or after a major surge event



Cold weather means more electrical risks from using devices like space heaters and electric blankets. Electrical failure causes an estimated **47,700 home fires** annually in the U.S.

Safeguard your family this winter with these tips:

- Avoid Overloading Outlets: Plug appliances directly into wall outlets. Use of extension cords for major appliances is dangerous.
- Space Heater Safety: Keep them at least three feet away from flammable items and never leave them unattended.
- Inspect Heating Pads & Electric Blankets: Check for fraying, charring, or damaged cords. Replace electric blankets older than 10 years.
- Use Generators Safely: Run portable generators outside only in a well-ventilated area, away from doors, windows, and vents to prevent deadly carbon monoxide poisoning.

Winter Energy Savings Tips

Winter weather can cause your home heating system to work overtime. Check for air leaks and drafts around doors and windows, then seal them with weatherstripping or caulk. Close fireplace dampers when not in use and consider installing insulating curtains to help keep warm air inside. You can also save energy by lowering your thermostat a few degrees. Even small adjustments like these can reduce heating costs and improve comfort during the coldest months.

Winter Tree Trimming

- Trees near power lines can pose serious risks. We trim to reduce the danger of arcing and prevent accidents.
