## LOW INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE FUND (LIEAF)

Gov. Snyder signed into law Public Act 95 in 2013, creating the Low-Income Energy Assistance Fund or "LIEAF", authorizing the Michigan Public Service Commission (MPSC) to raise up to \$50 million annually for low-income energy assistance payments. The money would come from a surcharge of no more than \$1 per meter per month for all Michigan electric utilities participating in the LIEAF program.

On July 27, 2022, the MPSC issued an order (U-17377) increasing the monthly surcharge from \$0.87 to \$0.90 per meter for the billing months of September 2022 through August 2023. The surcharge is limited to electric bills only and to one electric residential meter per residential site. The surcharge was effective on PIE&G's electric bills generated on or after Oct. 1, 2022, for services rendered in September. Annual bills generated in 2023 will be prorated accordingly.

# ADVANCED METERING (AMI) & FIBER UPDATES

#### AMI

- 29,300 electric meters deployed (about 84% of the total 34,600 active meters).
- Installation of an additional 18 one-hundred foot communication poles is expected to be completed by mid-October. The poles were constructed locally by Moran Iron Works.
- In 2023, plans are to deploy natural gas AMI modules and additional communication sites.

#### **FIBER INTERNET**

- Over 135 services connected in Onaway area (ON1 and ON4 zones are open for service).
- Canada Creek (CC3) zone opened for service Sept. 6.
- Over 355 miles of fiber installed.
- Over 2,500 members have submitted interest in receiving PIE&G Connect high-speed internet.



### CAPITAL CREDIT REFUNDS COMING SOON
